# A Message from our Executive Director & Board President

As we reflect on the year 2025, we recognize it as a year of transition, intention, and renewed direction. While we experienced a slight decline in overall participants and members served, we saw an increase in both Club visits and the number of snacks and meals provided—an encouraging indication that the children and youth we serve are engaging more deeply and consistently in our programs. This continued connection speaks to the strength, relevance, and impact of our work within the community.

2025 also marked the launch of our new five-year Strategic Plan, *Growing Together, Creating Opportunities*. This plan will guide our work through six key aspirations, ensuring we remain focused on delivering meaningful, high-quality experiences for children, youth, and families across The Battlefords.

## Cultivate a Thriving Workplace

At the heart of our organization is our people. In 2025, we were proud to employ 60 dedicated staff, 11 of whom were former Club members—an inspiring reflection of the lasting impact of our programs. We also celebrated 16 staff through our Employee Service Recognition Program, acknowledging their commitment ranging from one to ten years of service.

This year brought transition within our administrative team, as we said goodbye to several valued members and welcomed new team members into key roles. These changes, combined with ongoing recruitment challenges, resulted in an increased workload for our remaining team. We extend our sincere appreciation to our staff for their resilience, adaptability, and unwavering dedication to the children, youth, and families we serve.

## Foster a Culture of Belonging

We remain committed to creating safe, inclusive, and welcoming environments where every child and youth feels a sense of belonging. Our team continues to respond to the diverse and evolving needs of participants, recognizing that supporting each individual comes with both opportunities and challenges. In 2025, 57% of our staff identified as coming from diverse backgrounds, strengthening our ability to reflect the communities we serve and ensuring that children and youth see themselves represented within our programs. Through intentional programming and meaningful relationships, we strive to ensure that every young person who walks through our doors feels valued, respected, and empowered to be themselves.

## Inspire Investments in BGC

The impact we make would not be possible without the ongoing support of our funders, donors, and community partners. We are deeply grateful for multi-year funding agreements with organizations such as the Ministry of Social Services, Cenovus Energy, and Strathcona Resources Ltd., as well as the continued support from valued partners including the City of North Battleford, Innovation Federal Credit Union, and Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation.

In 2025, we also celebrated another successful year of fundraising through our signature events: Pink Shirt Day in partnership with Discovery Co-op, the FFUN Dodge Race for Kids, and our annual Gala—marking a milestone 25th year with our Silver Gala celebration. These events continue to bring our community together while generating essential funds to sustain our programs.

## Elevate Our Influence

As we continue to grow, so too does our presence and reputation within the community. Through expanded programming, strengthened partnerships, and consistent delivery of high-quality services, we are working toward being recognized as a leading child and youth-serving organization in The Battlefords.

Our collaboration with community partners remains vital to this effort, and we are proud to work alongside organizations that share our commitment to supporting children and families.

### Deepen and Expand Life-Changing Impact

In 2025, we continued to build on our program offerings to reach children and youth where they are. We proudly operated our second year of Before and After School programming in Battleford, hosted at Battleford Central School (BCS) and serving students from both BCS and St. Vital. We also expanded programming at Holy Family School by introducing a Before School Program for the first time, now offering both before and after school care at that location. Our satellite sites at Bready and EMBM remained strong, ensuring continued access across multiple school communities.

Our ongoing commitment to measuring impact through our Learning & Impact Project provides clear evidence of the difference we are making. This year, we saw that 83% of children and youth are more physically active, 86% are better at helping others, 83% have a more positive influence on those around them, and 83% feel more comfortable being themselves. Additionally, 89% reported increased knowledge of healthy eating. These outcomes reinforce that the work we do is not only meaningful—but truly life-changing.

### Strengthen Operational Excellence

This year marked significant progress in strengthening our infrastructure and capacity for growth. We successfully completed Phase 1 of renovations at our Special Programs Site, a building generously donated by the Fransoo Family in 2024. The renovation of the gymnasium was a major milestone, enabling a new partnership with Battlefords Minor Baseball Inc., who will begin utilizing the space in 2026 as an indoor training facility.

This development not only enhances community collaboration but also creates new opportunities for us to expand our own programming in the space, including soccer and lacrosse. Investments like these ensure we are well-positioned to support future growth and deliver high-quality programs for years to come.

None of this progress would be possible without the continued leadership and governance of our Board of Directors. In 2025, we said goodbye to Director Matthew Pruden and thank him for his five years of dedicated service. We were also pleased to welcome Elnette Cilliers and Jose Pruden to the Board, whose perspectives and commitment will help guide our organization forward.

As we look ahead, we do so with confidence and gratitude. Together—with our staff, Board, partners, and community—we are continuing to grow, create opportunities, and make a lasting impact in the lives of children and youth.

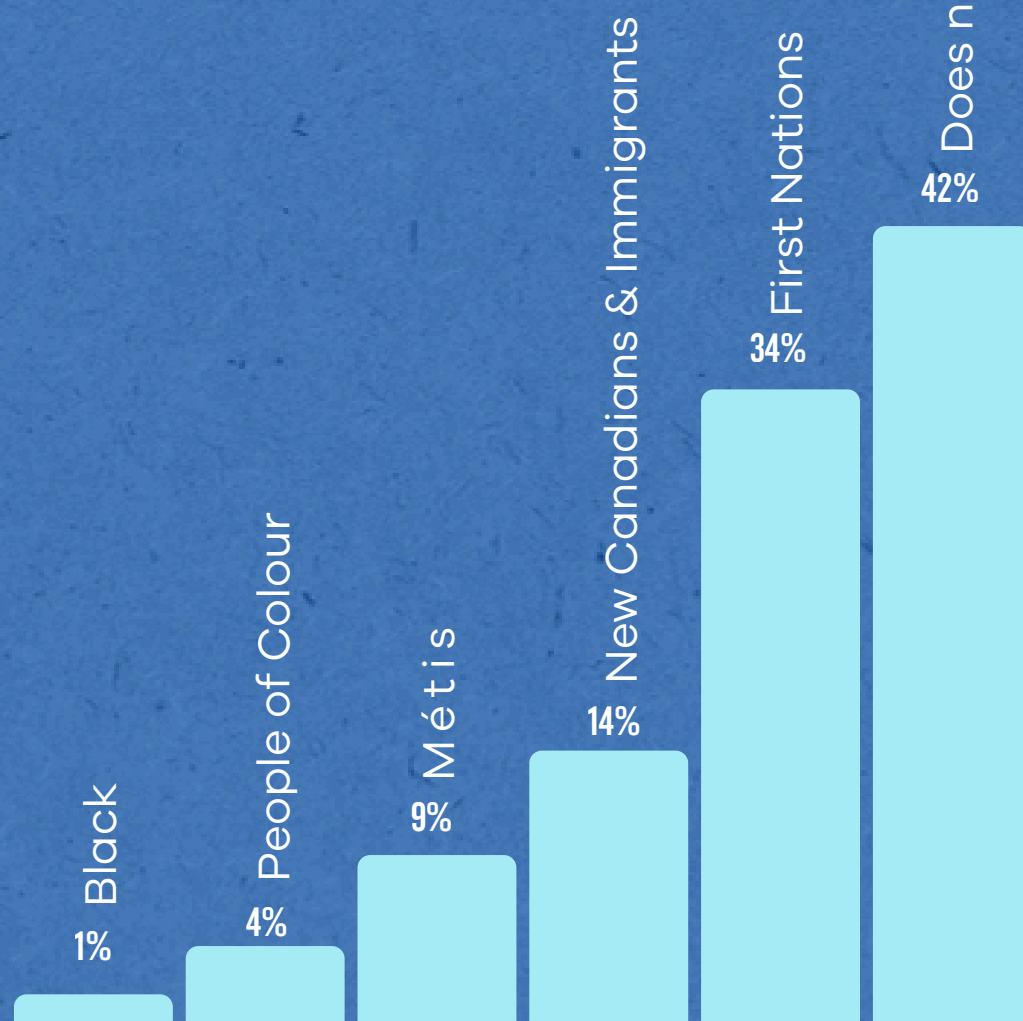




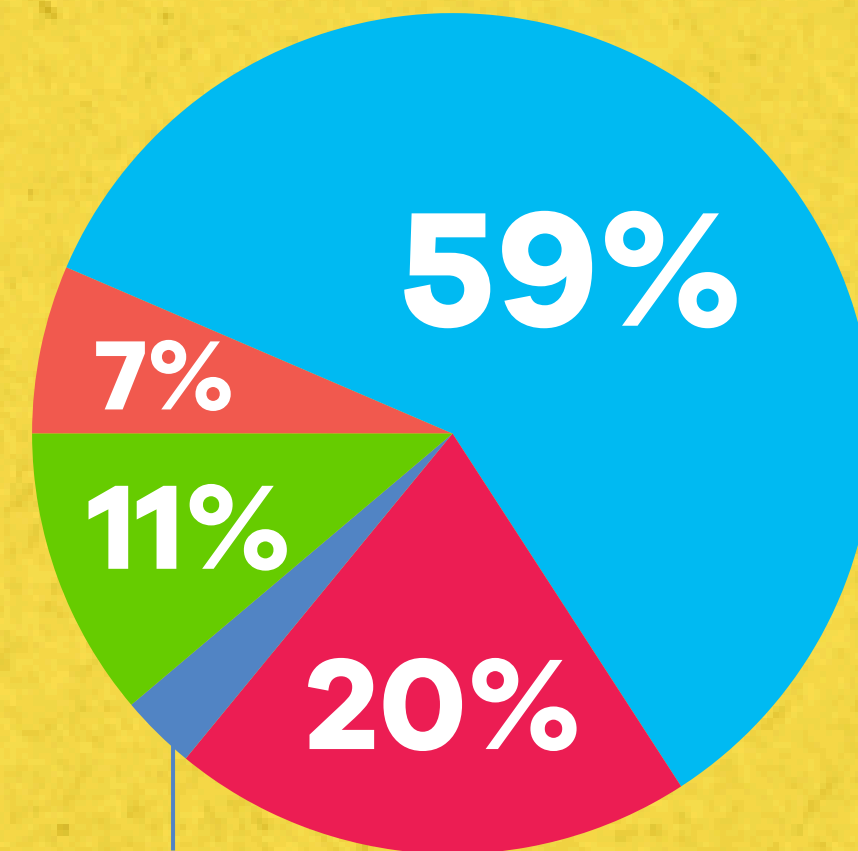

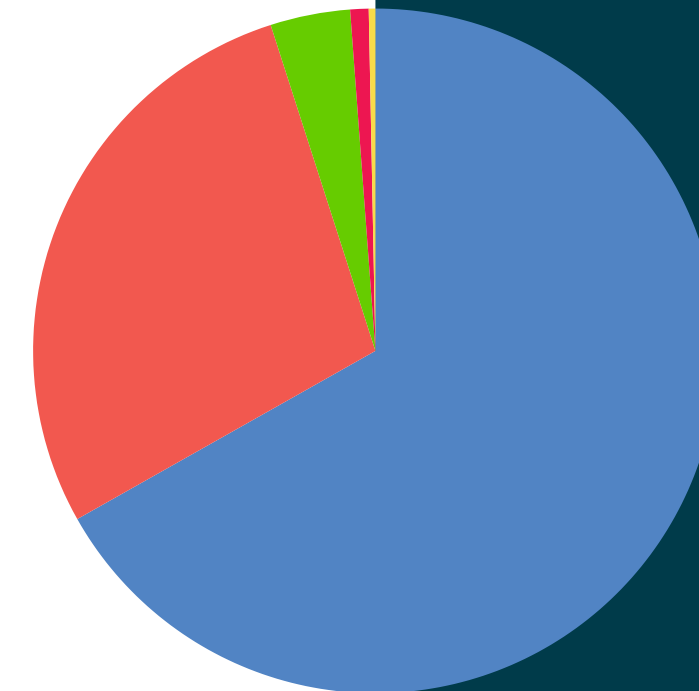
